By being clearer and more present in your relationships, you demonstrate the constructive use of emotional integrity. This might mean expressing anger without aggression while keeping its passion or identifying and sharing emotions openly without apology or pretense. You use your emotions to nurture, strengthen, and enhance your connections, and apply effective conflict-resolution skills when needed.

Instead, you strive to be radically present, honest, and fully engaged in your own life, while vulnerably connecting with others. Living your purpose, you intentionally make a positive difference in the world, acting from care, compassion, and consciousness.
